General Information

Wills Eye Institute is located at 840 Walnut Street (SE corner of 9th & Walnut). **Enter driveway** on Walnut Street just before 9th St., make left (directly across from Walnut Street Theatre); rate on Saturday is \$22 max @ day (less 15% discount with validation). Alternate parking locations: 8th & Chestnut, 8th & Walnut; 10th & Walnut. Wills is easily accessible by **public transportation**.
