

William S. Tasman, MD 1929-2017

Dr. William Tasman was a leading light in ophthalmology and a pillar of Wills Eye Hospital for more than 50

years. His contributions to the field and to the institution were manifold, his leadership unmatched. A visionary pioneer, innovator, and educator, he served as Wills Eye's Ophthalmologist-in-Chief from 1985 to 2007. The hundreds of residents and fellows he mentored during that time have gone on to prominence in many fields, and careers of consequence and contribution. Dr. Tasman's legacy endures in the skill and compassion that he instilled in these physicians, in the vision he preserved and restored for his patients, and in the specialty of ophthalmology that he left better than he found it. 
